<u>Fee</u>: \$300 for a single course; \$250 per course if enrolled in 2 or more courses.

<u>Practical Analytic Subjectivity II</u> Wednesdays 8:00am-9:15am Jan 24, 31; Feb 7, 14, 21, 28; Mar 6, 13, 20, 27; Apr 3, 10, 17, 24; May 1, 8, 2024. This is an *experiential* course which provides an opportunity for clinicians to discuss the difficulties and pleasures of their day to day work. There is an emphasis on countertransference and its co-creation. It is facilitated by two instructors. There are no readings for this course.

Note: Trauma course and Gender course are taken together:

<u>Trauma</u> Wednesdays 9:30am-10:45am Jan 24, 31; Feb 7, 14, 21, 28; Mar 6, 13, 2024. Because most of what we clinicians see in our daily practices is somehow related to trauma, this course includes papers on affect regulation, dissociation, enactment, intergenerational transmission of trauma, implicit memory, mentalization, PTSD and neurophysiology, and witnessing, by authors such as Boulanger, Benjamin, Bromberg, Bucci, Davies, Grand, Shengold, Stolorow and van der Kolk.

<u>Gender</u> Wednesdays 9:30am-10:45am Mar 24, 31; Apr 3, 10, 17, 24; May 1, 8, 2024. There was a[n infamous] time in psychoanalysis when homosexuality was considered pathology and gender fluidity a 'confusion" and an "identity disorder." Gender was once seen as binary. Thankfully psychoanalysis has evolved to be much more inclusive, welcoming, and appreciative of a spectrum of genders. Gender and sexuality have been decoupled. We recognize that rejection by caregivers of their gender variant children and 'othering' by society at large leads to health problems such as depression, drug use, and unprotected sex.

<u>Clinical Case Conference</u> Wednesdays 11:00am-12:15am Jan 24, 31; Feb 7, 14, 21, 28; Mar 6, 13, 20, 27; Apr 3, 10, 17, 24; May 1, 8, 2024. This course is designed to support the clinician's work and offers opportunities to integrate clinical material with psychoanalytic concepts, including ethics, and ways to deepen the psychoanalytic process, with a focus on the therapist's self reflection, the clinical relationship, and ways to facilitate what is mutative for the patient. Attendees are encouraged to present case material.
